23rd March – 23rd April Bristol Water Fisheries Report



What a windy spell we've had! No less than 12 cancelled days of boats on Chew and Blagdon since the last report. The frustration has been that the days which have been fishable have been fishing very well. This weather hasn't stopped our work though, we've managed to stock circa 5000 fish across our reservoirs at 9 different locations, with scope to stock at more locations once the water levels drop and the ground becomes firmer.

Fish continue to remain relatively high in the water across both lakes and are taking to nymphs as well as the usual blobs and fabs. We've seen rod averages up to 15.33 on Chew at the end of March, Blagdon's been similar when the weathers been good, like it was for a few days at the beginning of April we saw best boats catching up to 20+ fish. Barrows continues a steady weekly average of around 3 with some weeks going up to 4.5.

Unfortunately, due to planned pumping work the water levels at Barrow 1&2 dropped to the point that they were too dangerous to fish. The positive news is these are now safe to fish and back open. Barrow 3 remains open, but please be careful as this one is still refilling. North Shore on Chew remains closed however we have completed a health and safety audit and have works planned to open Northshore in the near future. We will notify all anglers once this is safe to fish once more. Thank you for your patience.

CHEW

Fishing on Chew towards the end of March and beginning of April was understandably mixed due to the weather conditions. However, the back end of April and the moments of calm we fleetingly saw provided some quality fish and world class angling.

The fish continued to remain high up in the water which was capitalised on with floating lines and midge tips. Nymphs have been incredibly popular with small black buzzers, olive/black muskins and diawl bachs all proving to be working well.

With the change in our stocking policies pockets of fish have been caught all over the lake. Areas that fished well include Denny Island, False Island, Roman Shallows, Walley Bank, Herons Bay, and North Shore. Its all been about covering water and being able to target those trout.

North shore fished particularly well with Pegs Point into Rugmoor bay proving to be a hot spot with many bank anglers bagging up after a couple of hours. Top End switched on towards the end of April with lots of fish moving but getting them to take a fly has been the real challenge (isn't it always).

Nymphs again have proven to be the best choice with small black buzzers, diawl bachs and muskins the pick of the lot. We are noticing a change from fish targeting colour to feeding heavily on naturals.
