23rd April – 28th May Bristol Water Fisheries Report



It seems we completely bypassed Spring and went straight into Summer! The settled weather really switched the fish on with good hatches of Buzzers on both Chew and Blagdon, the Barrow tanks also having had some rather impressive evening hatches!

With the water levels now stabilised we are pleased to allow fishing to return to all three tanks!

Whilst the fish have been grateful for the abundance of food it has made for some testing conditions. We have seen early Corixa, Buzzers, Pin-fry and even Damsels emerging. This coupled with the filamentous algae and increased light levels have made the anglers really have to work at their fishing to have consistent sport through the day.

Our stocking programme is in full swing with another 5150 Going into Chew 3000 into Blagdon and 1200 Into barrow in the past few weeks.

The eagle eyed will have noticed one of the cages has been floated from its mooring ready to be stocked with 5000 fish ready for our late summer stockings.

The cages not only free up valuable space on the farm but allow us to mitigate the stress on the trout during the warmer months as it removes the need to transport the fish in the trailers prior to stocking.

The cages also offer a great halfway house, allowing the fish to acclimatise to the lake temperature, they will also start to adjust their feeding habits as anything that passes through the cages become fair game to the hungry Trout!

CHEW

Chew started the month in fine form with plenty or reports with 20+ fish to the boat and our bank anglers catching consistently from Walley and Woodford banks!

Our Stocking plan is to introduce 1000-1200 every week for the next eight weeks to keep those fish coming in the inevitable warmer spells!

We have seen plenty of fish high in the water on Chew, washing lines and dries made up the mainstay of the catches in early May. The mighty Muskins still seemed to be a favoured dropper fly with our anglers, with Hi Viz and UV being replaced with more natural black and brown patterns. Small back boobies and fabs made an excellent point fly fished in conjunction with a floating line or midge tip.

As the month progressed, we have seen more pin-fry and Damsels showing particularly around Denny Island, Hollow brook, East Shore and even around the jetties. As you would expect the fish didn't miss a free meal and could be found very tight into the margins and reed lines.

As the month progressed another wave of 1000+ fish were stocked between Nunnery and the Sailing club. Those stocked from Nunnery have started to show in open water and those from the Sailing club seem to have taken residence in the Dam basin bolstering the numbers of fish holding off Walley bank.

Rod Averages were incredible at the start of the month with the first week producing a rod average of 8.30.

The great returns continued in our competitions with a huge average of 10.5 in the Blagdon Fly Fishers Spring Cup and 7.5 in the Airflo Celtic League.

Our rod average has dropped down in the latter part of the month due to the current conditions to 3.64; With the average size sitting at just above 2.6lbs we are seeing some superb fish coming out of Chew including this lovely 6.75lb Rainbow caught by Terry Feest and this 9lb Rainbow by Peter Holdsworth, well done Terry and Peter!



BLAGDON

Blagdon has had a great spell of bank fishing earlier in the month with many bank anglers focusing their attention on North Shore in particular Pegs point!



As the month has gone on the feeding spells seemed to have become concentrated around first and last thing.

As evidenced by the catch returns there are seemingly tons of fish, high in the water and topping, in Rugmoor and Top End. Getting them to take a fly on the other hand has been proving frustrating for many anglers, but such is the fickle nature of fishing.

With the changeable weather coupled with the abundance of food in the form of large black buzzer, corixa and damsels and the added challenge of the same filamentous algae, we have seen on other lakes. These factors have left the anglers having to really think about timing to maximise on the early and late feeding spells.



Our Boat anglers have found fishing very similar with Top End being productive, we have seen some good numbers of fish also holding up in Butcombe especially when we were on the receiving end of the powerful southerly winds!

With a rod average of 4.09 in May the fishing was consistent. We stocked a total of 3000 rainbows over the past few weeks. with more planned over the coming weeks!
